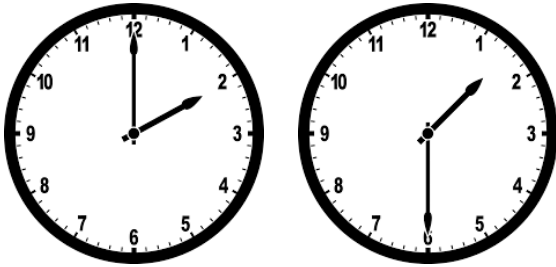

Type of show: Pyro

Pyro means there will be fire involved.



Type of show: Kinetic

Kinetic means it moves.



Type of show: Robotic

Robotic means it is a machine.



Type of Show: Installation

An **installation** is a large-scale environment that is 3D and sometimes interactive.



Type of Show: Music



The installation is interactive meaning you can take part.

You don't have to if you don't want to.



The show lasts 3 hours, but you can come and go as you wish.



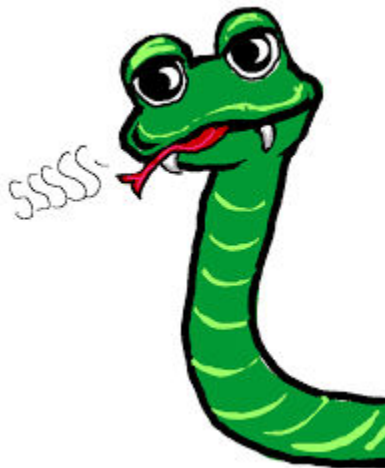
During this time you can arrive and leave the show at any time.



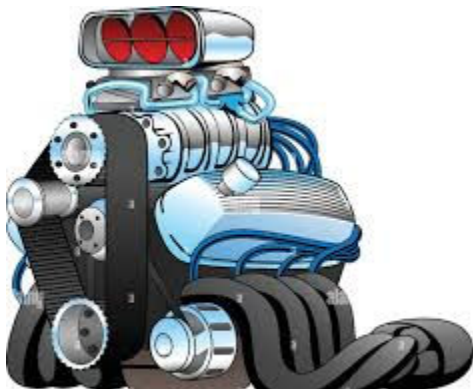
There will be music based on 1970's disco.



There will be the noise of fire shot from mirror balls and old brass instruments.



There will be the sound of air escaping from the snake's mouths that represents hissing.



There will be the noise of electrical motors that move the snake's bodies.



There will be various congratulatory noises as player has success at the game.



There may be various horn sounds to indicate the reset of the game or a new high score.



A **content warning** lets the audience know that the show might contain things that are upsetting to some viewers.

This helps the person decide if they want to see the show.



The show contains **flashing lights**.



The show contains **smoke**.



The show contains **fire**.



Don't worry the installation is safe and operated by a professional.

There will be stewards and volunteers to help and guide your journey. Please ask them if you need any help. They will be wearing bright pink or blue t-shirts.

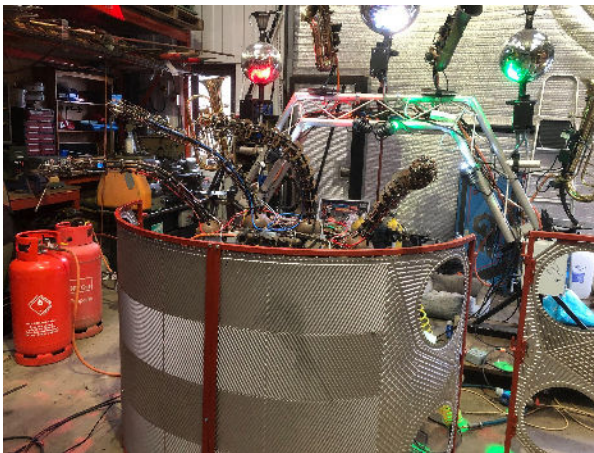


If you need help finding a show, you can go to the Access Hub to ask for support.

The Installation



The back of the show is a 3m high arch with 3 x (occasional) flaming mirror balls and 4 x occasional flaming old brass instruments.



The middle ground is a module of 4 animatronic snakes that have eyes that blink, tongue's that protrude, mouths that open, and breathe fire, and dance.

Animatronic means a life-like robot.



The foreground consists of a screen and a touch pad standing on a table. They are constantly changing colour.



There are also elements of found old **arcade games** in the design.
