Welcome to Out There 2024!

Welcome to the 16th Out There International Festival of Street Arts and Circus! It's another packed edition with 32 artistic companies coming from nine different countries, over 100 performances and opportunities to enjoy. There's a huge variety of work spanning circus, street theatre, dance, music, clowning, carnival, games, installations, roller-skating juggling, hair-hanging, sword-swallowing, treadmill breakdancing, sideshows, workshops – truly something for everyone and almost all of it for free!

As ever there is a lot of new work to enjoy including ten World and UK Premieres, with nine shows also having been 'made in Great Yarmouth'. We welcome to Great Yarmouth for their first times French acrobats Collectif Bim, the comedy blood-splatter of Parasite Circus, the beautiful bicycle acrobalance of Duo Kaos, Simple Cypher's fusion of Hip Hop and Circus and many more. Many favourite artists also return this year including Flemish circus greats 15feet6, Portuguese fanfare band Kumpania Algazarra, world famous clown Fraser Hooper and the last ever outing of the legendary Insect Circus.

Out There strives to make high quality arts as accessible to all as possible. From this year the festival has moved to May and this has helped us work with education and community partners to generate more opportunities for participation than ever before. A key partner here has been SENDfest who have collaborated with us to integrate the Out There Festival into their programme and helped us develop our access offer.

The festival is also delighted to be able to return to the fabulous Hippodrome Circus with Marisa Carnesky's 'SHOWWOMEN' – a modern exploration of historic pioneer circus artistes, replete with hair-hanging, sword-swallowing, leopard print and ectoplasm! What's not to like?

THE ICE HOUSE THROUGH TIME

The significance of
The Ice House and its
role in Great Yarmouth's
fishing industry.

AN IMPORTANT BUILDING FROM THE BEGINNING.

The exact year of its construction remains one of The Ice House's greater mysteries. It was likely built between 1851 and 1892 as one of ten similar facilities in Great Yarmouth. It played a crucial role in the town's fishing industry, and its national and international connections have been intertwined with the town's economy throughout its golden age.

Historically, Great Yarmouth's economy was buoyed by fishing, a trade that has sustained the town since the 14th century. It wasn't until the 19th century with the rise of industrialisation and a surge in consumer demand, that buildings like The Ice House became essential.

ADAPTING TO CHANGE.

Soon after however, two world wars and continued overfishing decreased the trade until the seasons finally ended in the 1960s. This, alongside people's changing taste and inventions such as refrigeration in the early part of the century, meant that the role of the Ice House and Great Yarmouth's economic landscape were transformed, leaving tourism and entertainment in its wake.

While tourism in Great Yarmouth has been recorded since the 1700's, the very same railways which were shipping goods from the Ice House,

spurred a development in tourism and popular culture. This enabled the Victorian public to reach the rapidly growing tourist attractions of the town and transforming previously local and informal purposes of entertainment, such as the circus, into a professional and international phenomenon. The circus in particular was also growing in popularity at the same time as the Ice House's heyday, with the Victorian enthusiasm for the artform attributed to a visit from PT Barnum to Queen Victoria in March of 1844.

THE ICE HOUSE TODAY.

Even with the decline in the herring trade and a change of the economy, the Ice House still stands proudly on Great Yarmouth's historic quayside. Now, the town's international connections don't come in the form of imported ice and exported herring, but imported talent and exported culture; and this project by Out There Arts is transforming the Ice House into a symbol not only of Great Yarmouth's past herring industry, or its present as a culture and heritage hub, but its future as the UK's capital of circus.

THE CENTRE OF THE HERRING INDUSTRY.

Thanks to The Ice House, fresh fish could be consumed inland for the first time, allowing the working population access to a food source previously controlled by the landed gentry who owned the rivers fished inland.

The immense import and export economy that The Ice House facilitated, introduced important international connections that kept the industry running. Ice imported from Norway used in the preservation process allowed herring to be exported to countries such as Russia, Italy, New York and Germany.

The Ice House continued to play an important role throughout the height of the industry in 1913, when thousands of Scottish fishermen and fisher girls (affectionately known as Silver Darlings), who would follow the shoals down the East Coast of Scotland and Yorkshire before reaching Great Yarmouth for the autumn herring season. Women of all ages made this annual journey south, whether young or old they were always called 'girls'. They were employed by the fleets, gutting up to 60 fish per minute.

The Great Yarmouth Herring was internationally renowned – it was on the breakfast menu for the Titanic!
